By the time you get this Newsletter, the election will be over. Some of you will be happy at the results, some will be not so happy, and some may even be indifferent.

Whatever our emotional response to the election might be, our spiritual response should never be in question. In God's Word we have our explanation AND our instructions.

**Romans 13:1** Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God.

1 Timothy 2: First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people,

<sup>2</sup> for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.

<sup>3</sup> This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior.

<sup>4</sup>who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

It seems this would be an excellent time to develop, or strengthen, some good habits.

- Pray positive things for the recently elected. They have, after all, been instituted by God.
- Actively seek things for which to be thankful. "All people" (1 Tim 2:1) includes 'kings and <u>all</u> who are in high places".

- Meditate on the revelation of 1 Tim 2:3.

And to echo the words of another great theologian, "That's all I have to say about that".


