Instead of being content to get just 'our kids' back to Camp, ARVBA congregations committed to reaching out to children and youth who were not actively, or consistently involved in church. As a result, our records revealed that Seventy-eight of the students enrolled this year had never attended a Church Camp before! How about That!!!

As the results show, an awesome number of professions of faith were recorded and many other life-changing decisions were made. Four churches from outside our Association joined us this year and Camp was much stronger because of their participation.



We Partnered Again!

On May 6th, the ARVBA partnered with Conway-Perry and North Central Associations to host the Arkansas Baptist State Convention's Smaller Membership Church pastors conference. Our Bi-vocational pastors were able gather with their peers for fellowship and to receive training and encouragement designed to strengthen the work in their unique ministry circumstances.



Missionary's Heart

It has been another good year for the ARVBA and her member churches. Most churches have continued to see a steady increase in Sunday School and Worship Service attendance and mission/ministry events have reflected an increase in participation as well.

A lot of meaningful ministry occurred through the efforts of the ARVBA and her member churches since our last Year-In-Review. The Recreation Ministry was heavily invested in helping churches reach their communities. Over twenty-six times, you guys brought the Rec Trailers to Block Parties, Church Festivals, Easter Events, and Mission Trips.

Church Camp and the Delta Mission Trip were both extraordinary in 2023. Vacation Bible School was even bigger in the River Valley this year and many souls were added to the Kingdom through that effort.

Following is a brief recap of ARVBA activities which will, hopefully, help get everyone up to speed on all the good things your contributions to Associational Missions made possible.

Camp was awesome again this year with 19 churches bringing 334 participants to enjoy a week at Spring Lake Baptist Camp and Retreat Center. Of those 334 campers, 58 were preschool to 4th grade, 87 were Middle School Campers, and 87 were grades 8-12. AND 78 of those Campers had never been to a church camp before! 100 Staffers kept everything running smoothly and everyone safe.

This year's focused attempt to bring more unchurched students to Camp resulted in more campers being born again than at any time in ARVBA Church Camp history! 74 Campers received Christ's salvation that week and many other lives were positively impacted as more than 20 students recommitted their lives to Christ's leadership and at least one expressing a possible call to ministry/ missions service.

Vacation Bible School was as big as ever in the ARVBA and that was due, in no small part, to the efforts your VBS Team put into providing our annual VBS Clinic. We sent the Team to Nashville this year to take advantage of Lifeway's National Training. The information they brought back enabled us to expand

our own training to include even more break-out topics and learning opportunities. We built props again for our churches to use and one set even traveled around the state to be used in their regional training events!

Many souls were added to the Kingdom through Vacation Bible School this year and we expect even greater things in 2024. Our goal is to re-imagine the annual VBS Clinic in hopes of making it more relevant to whichever curriculum your church decides to use.

The Mission Trip!



The annual *ARVBA Mission Trip* took a different turn this year. Instead of returning to the Kansas City area, we headed to the vast, mosquito laden wilderness known as 'The Arkansas Delta'. Bro. Danny wrote, "I have never been more proud to be a part of Associational work as I was that week". Thirty-one participants from eight ARVBA churches completed seven Mission projects in five days!

The Team provided our first full-scale VBS for one church while we were there and one young lady was saved!. Bro. Ron Rambo was able to join us again this year which meant we had really great meals. We enjoyed awesome morning devotionals, and not a lot of sleep. Five days of hard work and loud laughter in five different locations made this an adventure to remember and the mission team is already praying about possibilities in 2024.

2023 offered extraordinary opportunities to share the gospel

by either picking up a chainsaw, a shovel or other ministry tool. In January, the Team deployed to the to DeWitt/Gould, area to provide flood relief. February found the unit responding to a wind event in Fordyce where they helped with Incident Management, damage assessments, and chainsaw work.

In March our folks traveled to Mississippi to lend a hand with chainsaw recovery work. Before that task could be completed, the Team was re-called to Arkansas (early April) to deal with tornado damage in Little Rock, Wynne, and areas in between.

In June, the unit was busy in our own area responding to wind damage reports in Pottsville, Russellville, London, Dover, Knoxville, and Hector. After that, it was off to Faulkner County for more chainsaw work followed by deployments to Georgia and Florida installing temporary roofs and providing chainsaw work.
