






As we in the ARVBA know very well, One Day Acts 1:8 Missions Experience provides an annual opportunity for Arkansas Baptists to impact lostness in a specific area of our state. Partnering with the churches of a local Association, Arkansas Baptists from across the state spend five hours on the first Saturday in October serving in a variety of ministries. Since One Day began, more than 25,000 Arkansas Baptists have partnered together to do missions on this single-day missions adventure. That's almost 2,000 Arkansas Baptists missionaries serving each year!

At least 1,172 salvations have been recorded across the state and during the past thirteen One Day Mission Trips, an Arkansas Baptist led someone to faith in Jesus every 3 1/2 minutes That is quite a testimony!

Mrs. Emily Smith, Abuse Prevention and Response Consultant/Children's Specialist with the Arkansas Baptist State Convention's Sexual Abuse Response and Resource Team (SARRT) will lead this very important training.

Protecting minors and those vulnerable from sexual abuse should be a top priority in God's churches and that will be the focus of this Saturday morning event. But we will also touch on topics your church may not have considered.

The ABSC and ARVBA actively encourage state and local congregations to implement strategies that will protect every individual. We take seriously our responsibility to report any abuse that we encounter, and, because we want to love like Christ, a secondary goal is to assist those in need, especially when ministering to survivors of abuse.

The seminar will begin at 10 o'clock and will conclude with lunch provided by the Arkansas River Valley Baptist Association. Two different sessions are planned at this time with a break in between. The cost for this event is only \$5.00 which helps with expenses and makes future training opportunities available. Every active member of the church (especially leaders) will benefit greatly from this instruction.


