

From Facebook to our texting service, if something of importance is coming to the Association and/or our churches, your heads-up will probably begin with “Hey ARVBA!”, so keep that in mind when something pops up on your phone or social media. My intent is to keep this article brief in order to leave room for the really “Hey ARVBA!” worthy information, but I do want to share a couple of opportunities I had since the GoodNews Letter last went out.

First, The Heart & 4 Fields evangelism at 1st, Oppelo was awesome and it did my heart good to see folks from my home church in attendance. The energy and passion in the room reminded me of two important truths. Truth #1. It is not difficult to learn how to share the Gospel effectively. Truth #2. Many of our church folks really want to know how.

With that being said, you should probably not be surprised if a similar training event comes to your Association soon. Until that time, I have asked Dr. Clint Richie to join us at our next Block Party Training on April 25th. Bro. Clint is Assistant Missions Team leader at the State Convention and he will talk about how to initiate a ‘Gospel conversation’ during your outreach events using the ‘witnessing bracelets’ you are familiar with. In addition, we will be looking at ways to follow-up with those who make decisions during your block parties and other large-crowd functions.

Another opportunity that blessed my heart was the latest eight-week SmartStart Interim at 1st Plainview. It was wonderful to see folks excited about learning (learning again) church things that were once common knowledge. More than just doctrine and theology

(though the importance of these two cannot be overstressed!), the church spent time looking at Sunday School, Missions and how their Cooperative Program giving actually makes a difference in the world. They learned that ‘church’ doesn’t just happen while, at the same time, they began to understand that ‘doing church’ is not all that hard. I even shared a quote from the Heart & Four Fields training: “There is nothing God can’t do through a fully committed church”.

Your Association has several resources available to help churches and church folks ‘rediscover’ the lost art of being Southern Baptists. And, of course, myself or other gifted ARVBA teachers would love to lead in a short-term Wednesday evening study over these or other topics.

Looking forward to enjoying all that the Lord has in store for the ARVBA in 2026!

Block Party Training & Certification

Our training consists of classroom instruction on various Block Party elements and is followed by outside activities (weather permitting) such as setting up and tearing down one or more inflatables, determining power sources, carnival layouts, etc.

INFLATABLES:

Certified Inflatable operators will oversee the setup and teardown of our ‘bouncy houses’ as well as how to repack and return them to their respective trailers. Training will also cover topics such as:

- Safe Generator operation
- Inflatable positioning (it really does matter where the sun will be!)
- Inflatable tie-down requirements and practices
- and more

FOOD COURT:

At present, your city/county may not require specialized training in food service before you can include ‘dogs & drinks’ at your event but that day is almost certainly coming. Our training will help you be prepared as well as help ensure you do not place any block party attendees in unnecessary danger.

Food Service Training will cover topics such as:

- Proper food handling, preparation & storage
- Setting up a cleaning station
- How to operate the Associational Popcorn, Cotton Candy, & Sno-cone Machines
- Returning the machines (and food products) to the trailers and securing for travel

NOTE: The ARVBA does not offer certification for food service. Our training is only for the purpose of helping participants be as safe and responsible as possible.

OTHER THINGS ‘CARNIVAL’:

Setting up games is easy. Setting them up correctly... not so much! We will learn about and observe ways to anticipate traffic flow, game placement in relation to food service and/or inflatables, proper ‘tossing’ distances when needed, etc. How about Music/announcements/security/prizes/etc? We will cover as much as we can and learn how to adapt on the fly.
