Missionary's Heart

1191 ... eleven hundred and ninety one ... One thousand, one hundred and ninety one. -

Whether presented in numeric form or written out, that number, without the proper context, doesn't really tell us much does it? Are we talking about miles? Gallons? Bro. Danny's tomato seeds? What is so significant about 1191 that warrants a mention in the Association's monthly newsletter?

One thousand, one hundred and ninety one is the number of Sunday School members ARVBA churches have lost in the last ten years. That is a 43% decline in JUST Sunday School members in JUST ARVBA churches! I imagine there will be some who suggest -1911 simply reflects a shift from traditional Sunday School to the more modern 'small group' (whatever label your church gives them). However, unless we can show a 1191 person increase in small group participation the argument becomes mute.

2058 ... Two thousand and fifty eight ... That is the number of RESIDENT ARVBA Church members lost in the past ten years.

2315 ... Two thousand three hundred and fifteen ... The number of worship service attendees who quit coming...

In years past, the approach of a new church year meant it was time to evaluate the ministries of the last. In recent times, that practice has gone the way of the Sunday Evening Service and is now observed by only a few congregations in our area. Could lack of 'ministry evaluation' help explain how Southern Baptist Churches could experience such heart-breaking decline during a time of modest population growth?

A website I visited in preparation for this article began with this paragraph:

"Evaluation is essential to any endeavor. Evaluation keeps us from repeating the same mistakes year after year. Planning asks, "What will we do?" before the event while Evaluation asks, "How did we do?" after the event. Only through evaluation can we discover what we did right, what we did wrong, what we could have done better, and what we will do next time."

A quick Google search on 'Evaluating Ministry' will bring up countless articles on how to evaluate 'ministers'. It is only when your search specifies church ministries that really helpful suggestions can be found. The following is an adapted snapshot from one website:

EVALUATE DIRECTION:

- If you continue in the same direction, where will you be in a year?
- Are members spontaneously initiating outreach?

EVALUATE GROWTH

- Has the number of members involved in ministry grown over the year?
- Are we reaching new target audiences or launching new outreach strategies?
- Did we start any new Sunday School classes?

EVALUATE "SUCCESS CRITERIA"

• It is one thing to evaluate whether you did things right. It is quite another to evaluate whether or not you did the right things!

Of course, no evaluation sample will work for every church and that is as it should be. Your church is very different than mine and your community is as unique as it is possible to be. But don't you think a Church Ministry Evaluation designed for your church, and by your church could be a good thing?


I only bring that up because Henry Ford's time-tested observation is still as true today as it ever was.
